Helping your child to play and learn something new

Find the "just right challenge." Not too easy not too hard.

THE EASIEST

- · Two containers only
- A big container and a much smaller container
- Round shapes

Show your child how by:

- · laying out the containers in order
- · putting one container inside the other yourself.
- using hand over hand support to help them pick up and put in.

Nesting toys helps a child learn how one object relates to another in size and space, problem solving and coordination



THE NEXT STEP

- Add another container small, middle size, big
- · Increase the number of containers as they learn
- · Line up cups in a way that helps your child know what to do next.





MORE LEARNING WITH HELP

- · Put out all the containers.
- · See what your child does on their own.
- If they get stuck, help find the right size that fits.
- Point to or give them the next one.
- · Give a choice of 2.

WAYS TO MAKE LEARNING EASIER:




- Line up in size order small to large.
- Point to the next container in size as they go along.


WHAT ELSE CAN YOU DO WITH NESTING CONTAINERS?

Put objects inside them.
Play in the bath.

WAYS TO LEARN ABOUT NESTING WITH NEW CHALLENGES:



- Use different shaped containers like squares.
- Look for things around house that fit into each other like measuring spoons and cups, cardboard boxes, shoes.
